Program Summary

Be a Good Neighbor, Feed a Gator is San Francisco State University's emergency meal card program. This resource is designed to respond to student food insecurity by providing free meals to the City Eats dining hall on campus. Students can be screened for meal card eligibility at the Dean on Call program, CalFresh Help Clinic or Student Health Services Nutrition Clinic.

Be a Good Neighbor, Feed a Gator is a partnership of the SF State Basic Needs Initiative, Sodexo and the Dean on Call program. Meals are donated by the campus community. Beginning in Spring 2020 Sodexo had partnered with Swipe Out Hunger to donate 2,200 meals per semester to the program.

Service Delivery Fall 2019

During Fall 2019, *Be a Good Neighbor, Feed a Gator* provided a total of 868 hot meals from City Eats to a 66 eligible students.
